Welcoming the Third VC



"Youth is the agent of change", declares LG Sinha

On 23 January, 2021, Lieutenant Governor, Manoj Sinha visited Central University of Jammu to review the ongoing projects and infrastructural development. Foundation stones were laid for infrastructural projects worth Rs 33.77 crores, including 12.4 km long Trikuta Chardiwari and Devika Mahila Chhatrawas, a 100 bedded Girls hostel, Whereas, Prabandhan Vidyapeeth, a Prefabricated Bhavan costing Rs 32 lakhs was inaugurated. Moreover, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between Central Universities of Jammu, Kashmir & Himachal Pradesh; besides a MoU between Central University of Jammu and IIT Jammu for academic exchange and collaboration. Lt Governor also released a handbook on Medicinal and Aromatic Plant Diversity of Central University of Jammu authored by Dr. Pankaj Mehta and Ms. Anjali Bala.

While addressing the gathering, the Lt Governor spoke on the length and breadth of the New Education Policy and new dimensions it will bring in the education system. Making a special mention of the

teaching fraternity, the Lt. Governor said that teachers can freely take new initiatives to focus on job-oriented education. Teachers are nurturing the powerhouse of the nation. They should encourage students to take up new research, tread new path of innovation which nobody has ever taken to explore, he added. Noting with satisfaction that students from as many as 13 States a studying in the Central University of Jammu, the Lt Governor asked the University Authorities to enrol





more students for various courses, affording opportunity to more local students and at the same time, ensuring quality of research.

While speaking on the occasion, Sh. Rajeev Rai Bhatnagar, Advisor to the Lt Governor stressed on more incubation, innovation and research activities to be carried out in the University. CUJ launches source study of Aerosols in Jammu



'Research project envisages 1-year rigorous sampling, followed by laboratory analysis'

Flagging off ceremony of "Source Apportionment study of Aerosols in Jammu" was held in the Campus on 6th April, 2021. Chief Guest, Suresh Chugh, Chairman, JKPCB and the then Vice Chancellor Prof. Ashok Aima inaugurated the air monitoring station. For this project, High volume samplers of latest technology will be installed at dierent signature sites viz. CUJ, Bari Brahmna, Vikram Chowk, Narwal and Kachhi Chawni for sampling of PM2.5 (the ne particles in air) in Jammu. This one-year rigorous sampling campaign will be followed by laboratory analysis of collected samples and receptor modelling to identify the major sources of air pollution in Jammu. The event was attended by Dean Prof. B. S. Bhau , Prof. Sunil Dhar, HOD, EVS, Dean, Sciences, Prof. Devanand , Dr. Ravi Kumar, Registrar, CU Jammu. Prof. S. N. Tripathi, IIT Kanpur, National Coordinator, NKN, NCAP was the guest of honor where as other knowledge partners Prof. B.R. Gurjar, IIT Roorkee, Prof. Suman Mor, Punjab University, Prof. Neeraj Rastogi, PRL, Prof. Khaiwal, PGI-Chandigarh, Prof. Sachin S. Gunthe, IIT Madras, Dr. Ankit Tandon, CUHP, Dr. Vinoj Velu, IIT Bhubansehwar, and Dr. Vijay Kanawade, University of Hyderabad joined through virtual platform. In his keynote address, Prof. S.N. Tripathi, put it on record that CUJ and JKPCB are the rest in presenting this model of the best coordination where a dedicated Aerosol Instrumentation Facility is coming up and Source apportionment study has been initiated under the aegis of the National Clean Air Programme. The Chairman, PCB emphasized upon the importance of Source apportionment study in understanding the causes of air pollution. MoUs between CUJ and JKPCB had earlier been signed in year 2019, 2020. Dr. Shweta Yadav thanked all the stakeholders from CUJ and JKCPB for their support and contribution in this project. Sh. B.M. Sharma, Member Secretary, Dr. Syed Nadeem, RD and Dr. Yashpaul, Scientist from JKPCB graced the ceremony.

NCC as General Elective Credit Course in Course Curricula under CBCS

Recognizing the importance of NCC in shaping the youth of the country, the University has decided to incorporate NCC as a "General Elective Credit Course" under the Choice Based Credit System, in line with NEP 2020 from the upcoming academic session 2021-2022 of the University. With the objective of the harnessing the full potential of NCC's capacity in youth development. NCC as a Credit Course is designed with an intent to transform NCC training into a curricular activity from extracurricular activity, thereby providing academic credits to students undergoing NCC Training. Syllabus of NCC adopted by Central University of Jammu for Senior Division will be covered in 300 periods over three year duration plus two camps of 10 days each for becoming eligible to appear in the NCC 'B' and 'C' Certificate examinations. Central University of Jammu has thereby,set a precednec for other Academic institutes of UT for incorporating the NCC as General Elective Subject.

The present initiative is the outcome of series of meetings held between Prof. Ashok Aima, Vice Chancellor, Group Commander NCC Jammu, Brig Satish Kumar and Colonel Dharmendra Pandey, Commanding Officer of 4 J&K Bn NCC Jammu. Dr. Pankaj Mehta, Associate NCC Officer of Central University of Jammu has been intrumental in the incorporation of NCC as General Elective Credit Course in University course curriculum under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS).



Carrying forward the ongoing celebrations of the glorious history of commemorating the 75 years of Independence of progressive India, a national level student-scholar seminar on "Unsung Indian women Freedom fighters: Historical, Cultural and Literary Refractions", organised by Department of English, Central University of Jammu was inaugurated in the university campus on 22 November, 2021 by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Ashok Aima and Padmashri Shiv Nirmohi in the Brigadier Rajinder Singh auditorium. Faculty Development Program on "Authentic Leadership & Excellence" 22^{nd} - 26^{th} Nov, 2021





International Environment Day


